## Year 2 Class corner

Year 2 have had a busy few weeks since the last time you read our class corner. We have been working hard performing our Christmas play of Bethlehem Bake Off. Despite a few technical issues, the children pulled it out of the bag and gave a fantastic performance. We hope that you enjoyed their performance!

In Maths, we have been building our knowledge on shape. We know the difference between 2D and 3D shapes and know that we call corners vertices. We have been practicing how to draw parts of a shape using symmetry. We are confident in counting the vertices, edges and faces of the shapes.

In our Writing, we have been reading the book "The Boy Who Sailed The World". For our independent write, we changed the story using our own ideas using the structure of the story. We are going to be writing the next part of the story, making our ideas an adventure story! Our focus is using capital letters and full stops in the right space as well as making our writing better using description.

RE has taught us about what the Nativity means to Christians. We had some visitors from St Marys church work with us to create an advent wreath. We learnt that we have to light a candle each Monday on the lead up to Christmas. Each candle represents love, joy, hope and peace. The middle candle represents Jesus. We have learnt that advent means 'coming' and created a reverse advent calendar where we give something to someone else rather than receiving something ourselves.

In Geography, we have been comparing the UK and Antarctica. We focused on the different travel methods as well as the weather. We learnt that Antarctica is much colder than the UK because it is further from the Equator.

Year 2 have had a fantastic term and continue to work hard. We look forward to sharing more learning with you in the next Year 2 class corner!
