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Year 5 Class corner

In Year 5 we have enjoyed a good start to our new half term.

Year 5 have been trying hard with fractions, using their times tables to convert fractions. Recently, we have now moved on to adding mixed numbers and fractions before converting improper fractions to mixed numbers. Testing reasoning and problem solving through our learning, the children have shown great resilience to continue with their maths learning journey.

In Science, we have enjoyed carrying out science experiments and writing about reversible and irreversible changes. Our favourites include mentos into coke and vinegar and bicarbonate of soda as they were the most reactive. We were all in wonder at the separation of water and salt in a solution. Using the correct vocabulary, making scientific hypotheses and recording results will give us great experiences for the future.

This half term, our PE is based around floor gymnastics and thanks to a series of fantastic gymnasts who show their skills when doing front rolls, backward rolls and different ways of travelling. From staying healthy and being active in PE the children moved onto our new afternoon learning; we have been looking at food and the nutrients in our Design and Technology lessons. The class have been talking about our favourite foods - what we aim to do is trial different food types, comment on the taste and consistency as well as creating a full meal.

For History we will be looking at the history of Harlow and the new town offer; including how the town was designed. We will design our own towns and have been drawing cities with one-point-perspective in Art, including practising rows of building, drawn in 3D going off into the distance.

Funding News!

Asda Rewards Cashpot for Schools

Cashpot for Schools is an initiative operated by Asda where they donate 0.5% of Qualifying Purchases during the Qualifying Period to eligible schools. Between <u>September 2nd and November 30th, 2024</u>, customers who shop with Asda using their Rewards app can choose a primary school to receive a percentage of their spend. Once you have opted in and selected F&B, ASDA will add £1 to our school Cashpot to help get us started. Also, our school will get an additional £50 added to our Cashpot, after at least one customer has shopped and scanned their Rewards app.
