<u>Year 6 Class Comer</u>

A Term at Hogwarts!

Year 6 have been experiencing the magical world of Hogwarts through books, film clips, and extracts. They have immersed themselves in their writing and produced some wonderful pieces they can be very proud of.

They became journalists and reported on the break-in at Gringotts Bank, the return of He Who Shall Not Be Named, and the final of the world-famous Quidditch tournament. The children wrote character descriptions of their favourite characters and brought various locations in the book to life through vivid setting descriptions.

We then explored a 'story within a story' - The Tale of the Three Brothers. The children learnt to re-tell the story to develop their oracy skills and then chose how they wanted to re-write and re-tell the familiar tale, including writing from a different perspective. They also added dialogue to develop characterisation.

In art, the children explored clay work. They designed, planned, and created their own clay dragon eyes, bringing their imaginative ideas to life. They revisited clay techniques and used their painting skills to add a burst of colour to their creations.

We also went on a school trip to Crucial Crew 2025, where the children took part in a variety of workshops to help prepare them for the transition to secondary school. They learnt about water safety, recognising healthy and unhealthy relationships, and the impact of anti-social behaviour. They were also taught how to identify unsafe situations when out and about. As part of the day, the children took part in realistic scenarios with Essex Police to enhance their awareness of drugs and knife crime.

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

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<u>Keeping Our Children Safe:</u> <u>Types of Abuse and How to Spot Them</u>

At Fawbert and Barnard's Primary School, we strongly believe that safeguarding is a shared responsibility. As part of our commitment to working with parents and carers, this week we're focusing on the different types of abuse and how you can spot the signs to help keep children safe.

What Are the Types of Abuse?

There are four main types of abuse that children may experience:

I. Physical Abuse:

This involves intentionally causing physical harm.

Possible signs:

- Unexplained bruises, burns, or cuts
- Wearing long sleeves in warm weather
- Fear of going home or flinching when approached

<u>2. Emotional Abuse</u>

This includes constant criticism, threats, or rejection that affects a child's emotional wellbeing.

Possible signs:

- Low self-esteem
- Withdrawn or anxious behaviour
- Sudden changes in behaviour or mood

<u>3. Sexual Abuse</u>

This involves forcing or enticing a child to take part in sexual activities. Possible signs:

• Difficulty walking or sitting

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- Inappropriate knowledge of sexual behaviour
- Reluctance to be left alone with certain individuals

<u>4. Neglect</u>

This is the failure to meet a child's basic needs, such as food, clothing, shelter, or medical care.

Possible signs:

- Constant hunger or tiredness
- Poor hygiene or untreated medical issues
- Inadequate clothing for the weather

What Should You Do if You're Concerned?

If you're ever worried about a child—whether it's your own or someone else's—it's important to act:

Z Talk to your child gently and without pressure.

Keep a record of anything concerning.

Contact the school's safeguarding team or Essex Children's Social Care.

At school, we take every concern seriously and act swiftly to support families and protect children.

Remember: You don't need to be certain that abuse is taking place reporting a concern is about ensuring a child gets the right help as early as possible.
